1. **Grace SHURTLEFF** was born 14 Jul 1924 in Ashley Co., Arkansas. She died 20 Apr 2001 in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried 23 Apr 2001 in Hamburg Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Grace was born on 14 July 1924 in Ashley Co., Arkansas, and was the fourth of eight children born to Walter and Ardell. Less than a week before Grace's 6th birthday her younger brother, Walter Ervin Jr., would die at age 3.

Obituary:

Mrs. Grace Shurtleff Stone, 76, of Hamburg died Friday, April 20, 2001, at the Drew Memorial Hospital in Monticello. A native of Ashley County, a resident of Hamburg for the past 15 years and a former resident of Monticello, she retired from the Monticello post office in 1966. She was a member of the First Baptist Church of Hamburg. She was preceded in death by her husband, Douglas V. B. Stone in August, 2000; her parents, Walter and Ardell Young Shurtleff; a brother, Norman Shurtleff; and a sister Ozell Poole.

Survivors include a son, Robert Stone and wife Fran of Crossett; a daughter, Joyce Hussey and husband J. C. of Berryville; four sisters, Mildred Johnson and Bobbie Roberts of Little Rock, Billie Sheppard of Alexandria, and Alice Grider of Crossett; three grandchildren, Robert Stone and wife Susan of Crossett; Robinan Gentry and husband Derrick of Monroe, LA, and James R. Shell and wife Donna of Manassas, VA; and five great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were at 11 a.m. Monday, April 23, in the First Baptist Church of Hamburg with Dr. Bobby Pennington and Rev. Klois Hargis officiating. Pallbearers were Billy Jack Ragland, Ronnie LaGrone, Tommy Hollis, Donald Wayne, Bob Rush and Freddie Martin. Burial followed services at the Hamburg Cemetery with arrangements by Jones Funeral Home of Hamburg. Memorials may be made to the Gideons International, P. O. 2. **Walter Ervin SHURTLEFF** was born² 22 Jul 1891 in Meadville, Franklin Co., Mississippi and was baptized³ 1907 in Central Baptist Church, Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died^{4,5,6} 11 Sep 1947 in Dermott, Chicot Co., Arkansas and was buried⁵ in Old Troy Cemetery, Drew Co., Arkansas. Walter married Maggie Ardell YOUNG on 14 Jan 1917 in Line, Drew Co., Arkansas.

Walter Ervin was born on 22 July 1891 in Meadville, Franklin County, Mississippi, and was the fifth child of William and Alice. Walter moved to Ashley County, Arkansas as an infant sometime between July 1892 and August 1893. His mother joined Central Baptist Church in Ashley County Arkansas in 1899, and his father would later join via baptism in August, 1904 when Walter was 13 years old. His parents were very active in the church during his teen years. Walter would be baptized at Central Baptist Church in 1907 at age 16 (Central Baptist Church records).



Walter married Ardell on 14 January 1917 in Line, Arkansas, and from that union would issue 8 children: 6 girls and 2 boys, with only one of the boys (Norman Faye) living past childhood. From Walter's June 1917 WW I Registration Card, he is noted as being of medium height and build, with light gray eyes and dark brown hair. At this time they are living in Hudspeth, Arkansas, (located along the Drew and Chicot county line) and he is "working for himself" as a farmer.

For the 1920 census, Walter and Ardell were living near Line, in Bayou Township, Ashley County, Arkansas, near Ardell's parents house. They have two children, Ozell and 2 month-old Mildred. It is noted they owned their home and had no mortgage against it. The couple was still living in Bayou Township for the 1930 census with children Ozell, Mildred, Alice, Grace and Walter Jr. listed.

Walter would be 52 years old when his last child, Billy Gail, was born in 1943 (Ardell was 43 years old). Walter died on 11 September 1947, just before the fourth birthday of Billy Gail. He was buried in Old Troy Cemetery, near Line, Drew County, Arkansas.

Note that the birth and death dates are incorrect in the "William Shurtleff Descendants" book. A 1910 census listing for Walter has not been found.

3. **Maggie Ardell YOUNG** "Ardell"⁷ was born^{7,8} 21 Dec 1900 in Line, Drew Co., Arkansas. She died² 12 Jun 1972 in Monticello, Drew Co., Arkansas and was buried in Old Troy Cemetery, Drew Co., Arkansas.



Ardell Young was born on 21 December 1900 near Line, in Collins Township, Drew County, Arkansas to Carden and Estelle. Sometime before 1910 Ardell would move with her family from the Drew County side of Line, Arkansas, to the Ashley County side as for the 1910 census the family was residing near Line in Bayou Township of Ashley County. Ardell was the third of ten children born to Carden and Estelle.

Ardell married Walter Ervin Shurtleff on 14 January 1917, within a month after her 16th birthday. One year later their first child, Ozell, was born when Ardell was 17. As seen from the Walter's biography, Ardell and Walter were residing near Line in Bayou Township, Ashley County, Arkansas for the 1920 and 1930 census.

In 1944 Ardell and Walter moved from line to Boydell, Ashley Co., Arkansas [Mildred Shurtleff Johnson]. Shortly thereafter, in September 1947, Ardell would be left a widow with three children still in the home: Norman, age 11; Bobby Jean, age 6; and Billy Gail, almost 4.

Ardell lived in Boydell, Ashley Co. for around eighteen years. In front of her house were several pecan trees--she sold pecans for additional income [Joyce G. Stone Hussey]. Ardell was in Boydell until about September 1962, when her youngest child Billy Gail left to attend business school in Little Rock. (The Boydell house burned sometime before 2004 and is no longer standing [Robert E. Stone]). She moved into her son Norman's house in Crossett, and remained there until September 1963, at which time she moved in with Billy into an apartment. Billy married Charles five months later and Ardell lived with Charles and Billy with visits to her other children until about March 1972, when she moved in with daughter Grace in Monticello.

Ardell had been diagnosed with diabetes in 1965, which became increasingly debilitating. Soon after moving in with Grace, she went to the nursing home in Monticello and was there a few years until her death. Ardell died on 12 June 1972 at the age of 71, after spending almost 25 years as a widow. She was buried beside Walter in the Old Troy Cemetery, near Line in Drew County.

Obituary from "The Banner News" (Magnolia, Arkansas), 13 June 1972:

Mrs. Ardell Shurtleff, 71, of Monticello, sister of Mrs. Ethel Dingler of 128 S. Oakland, died Monday. She was the widow of Walter E. Shurtleff and was a Baptist.

Other survivors include a son, Norman Shurtleff of Prescott; six daughters, Mrs. Mildred Johnson, Miss Bobby Shurtleff, Mrs. Billy Shepherd, all of Little Rock, Mrs. Ozell Poole of Mississippi, Mrs. Alice Grider of Crossett and Mrs. Grace Stone of Monticello; three brothers, Grady Young of Benton, Wilson Young of Virginia and Pete Young of Illinois; two sisters, Mrs. Helen Hair of Louisiana and Mrs. Ola Crawley of Florida, 16 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Funeral was at 2 p.m. today at Jones Funeral Chapel in Hamburg. Burial was at Old Troy Cemetery (Drew County).

4. **William Orlando SHURTLEFF**¹³ was born 25 Nov 1857 in Meadville, Franklin Co., Mississippi and was baptized^{2,3} 14 Aug 1904 in Central Baptist Church, Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died² 26 Jan 1925 in Dermott, Chicot Co., Arkansas and was buried¹⁴ in Dermott City Cemetery, Chicot Co., Arkansas. William married¹⁵ Alice Ella HEMBY on 12 Nov 1882 in Franklin Co., Mississippi.

William was born on 25 Nov 1857 in Meadville, Franklin Co., Mississippi, and was the first child born to Orlando and Jane. When William was seven, his mom died and Orlando remarried Sarah when he was 9 years old. His stepmother Sarah would also have a short life and died in Dec 1876 when William was 19.

In 1880 William was single and living by himself in Enumeration District #145 of Franklin Co.

In 1882 William married Alice Ella Hemby in Franklin Co., and would have five children in that region between 1884 and 1891. In July of 1892, William and Alice's daughter Mary Lucretia died at age 2. Between July 1892 and August 1893 the family would move some 200 miles north to Ashley County, Arkansas. In 1895 the couple would lose another infant when their last child, William Jr. was born and only lived a few days.

For the 1900 census the family resided in Bearhouse Township with all five of their living children: Charlie, Sarah Jane "Janie", Webb, Walter and James.

William's wife, Alice would join Central Baptist Berea Church in 1899, and his daughter Janie would be baptized in 1901. It was not until 1904 that William joined the church via baptism at the age of 46. He quickly became active in the church, for in 1904 he was appointed as a church "messenger to the association," and in January 1905 he was appointed as clerk pro tempore. In 1906 and 1907 William and Alice's children Webb and Walter were baptized. In 1909 and 1910 William and Alice would again serve as church association messengers (Central Baptist Church records).

In 1910 the family still resided in Bearhouse Township, with children Webb, Walter and James in the house.

Sometime between 1910 and 1920 William and Alice would move north to near Line, in Collins Township, Drew County, Arkansas (1920 Census). In the 1920 census both William and Alice are 62 and living on "Hamburg Road" in Line. Living with them was their youngest son James.

On 24 July 1921, William and Alice joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church. The change in membership was likely due to the move, which placed them closer to Mt. Olive Baptist Church (Mt. Olive is approximately 3.6 miles to the north of Central Baptist Church, or more than one-half an hour by horse carriage). However, it is also noted that Central Baptist Church had lost most of its membership by this time and was dissolved in 1924.

William died on 26 January 1925 in Dermott, Chicot County, Arkansas, and was buried in the Dermott City Cemetery. (Note that an incorrect death date is given in the Shurtleff descendant book).

5. **Alice Ella HEMBY** was born^{2,13} 18 Sep 1857 in Madison Pa., Louisiana. She died¹³ 29 Aug 1929 in Dermott, Chicot Co., Arkansas and was buried¹⁴ in Dermott City Cemetery, Chicot Co., Arkansas.

Alice Hemby was born 18 September 1857 in Madison Parrish, Louisiana to Dennis and Lenora and was the sixth of eight children. The family had just arrived in Louisiana from Mississippi only a few years prior. In 1860 the family is noted as living in Concordia Parrish, Louisiana and at that time they have six slaves: age 35 (male), age 35 (female), age 28 (female), age 10 (female), age 3 (female) and age 1 (female).

The time living in Louisiana was short, for by September 1863 the family returned to Mississippi and in 1870 is residing in Franklin Co., Mississippi, where Alice's parents were married 25 years earlier (perhaps the return to Mississippi was related to the Civil War, which would not end until April 1865). Alice grew up with her paternal grandmother, Sarah Wells Hemby, as she was noted in the home for both the 1860 and 1870 census. (No 1880 census has been found for Alice or the Dennis Hemby household).

On 12 November 1882 at age 25 Alice would marry William Orlando Shurtleff in Franklin County, Mississippi.

Alice was apparently a very dedicated Christian. Prior to moving to Ashley County, Arkansas, (about 1893) she was a member of Hopewell Baptist Church in Franklin Co., Mississippi, where it is also known that her father had been a member. Alice's maternal grandfather, James Cain, was one of the early pastors of another Franklin Co., Mississippi church--Zion Hill Baptist Church. He was pastor there from 1827-1832 (this church is still active as of 2005 and is known as Mt. Zion Baptist Church). It was Alice that in 1899 first joined Central Baptist Church in Berea, Ashley County, Arkansas. She joined on a letter of recommendation of Hopewell Baptist Church, Mississippi. It would be five years later that her husband William would join Central Baptist Church by baptism.

In October 1905, news would reach Alice in Ashley County, Arkansas, that her mother and youngest sibling, Charlie, had both died of yellow fever back in Franklin Co., Mississippi.

Further details on Alice's life during her marriage to William may be read about from William's biography. Alice became a widow at age 67 upon William's death in 1924. On 29 August 1929 at the age of 71 Alice died in Dermott, Chicot County, Arkansas and was buried with William in the Dermott City Cemetery.

6. **Carden E. YOUNG**⁷ was born 9 Jul 1872 in Arkansas. He died⁷ 1 Feb 1939 in Montrose, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried¹⁷ in New Troy Cemetery, Drew Co., Arkansas. Carden married⁷ Estelle H. TURNER on 18 Aug 1895.

7. **Estelle H. TURNER**⁷ was born 4 Oct 1878 in Mississippi. She died^{4,18} 9 Apr 1963 in Westlake, Louisiana and was buried¹⁷ in New Troy Cemetery, Drew Co., Arkansas.

Funeral will be at 2:30 p.m. Thursday at the Jones Funeral Chapel. Burial will be at Troy Cemetery.

Riley Lane Turner, born 12 July 1840 in Mississippi, is thought to be the eldest child of Samuel W. and Susan (unknown maiden name) Turner. Historical records for Riley are conflicted (as detailed further below), but it appears Riley was married to Mary (unknown maiden name) in 1860. In the 1860 census, he is enumerated as "Lane" (age 19) and he and Mary (age 18) reside in Calhoun Co., Mississippi. Also in the 1860 census it is noted that his parents and younger siblings are in a nearby household. (In the 1850 census, Riley is seen as a child in this household, which is then in Yalobusha Co., Mississippi; on 6 June 1852 a portion of Yalobusha County became Calhoun Co.)

An 1870 census enumeration for Riley has not been found, but in 1880 Riley and Mary are seen residing in the Fifth District of Yalobusha Co. Presumably they moved west from Calhoun Co. back into Yalobusha Co. A few items are of interest from the 1880 census. First, it appears that Riley and Mary have a daughter, Annie E., who was

born ca. 1872. From a census form entry, it appears that Annie may be adopted. Of further interest is the fact that Riley's son, Robert Lee Turner, who would be around 9 years old at this time, is not found. Matters are further confused by the fact that another child of Riley's, Estelle, should have been present in the 1880 census, but is not. Furthermore, it is known that Estelle's mother was not Mary, to whom Riley is shown married to in the 1880 census, but Margaret Loyd. In the 1880 census Margaret Loyd appears a few households away from Riley and Mary. So the question is--was Estelle an illegitimate child of Riley's? Where are Riley's children Robert Lee and Estelle for the 1880 census? One might conclude this could be the wrong Riley Turner, but several other factors indicate this is the correct Riley Turner in the 1880 census.

A 1900 census enumeration for Riley has yet to be found, and the next documented evidence of Riley is a 1906 land patent for 80 acres in Collins Township, Drew Co., Arkansas. In the 1910 census Riley is seen to be married to Margaret Loyd Turner, and though they are living by themselves, it is shown that she has had two children.

Riley died 11 May 1926, outliving Margaret by ten years. He is buried in the New Troy Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

15. **Margaret E. LLOYD**^{2,7} was born^{2,8} 3 Oct 1855 in Duck Hill, Montgomery Co., Mississippi. She died 22 Apr 1916 in Arkansas and was buried¹⁷ in New Troy Cemetery, Drew Co., Arkansas.

Margaret's birth year is given as 1866 on her headstone--however it is believed that 1855 is the correct year. From the 1880 census Margaret is seen as being 25 years old, and in the 1920 census she is 55 years old.

The following is from the research of David Young, located at <http://www.daytex.com/jtyoung.htm> as of Dec 2004:

Jesse Thomas Young was born in September 16, 1822 in South Carolina. Census records from the mid to late 1800's and family histories indicate that he was the son of James Young. No documented information has been found concerning his early life.

The first written documentation of Jesse Thomas Young appears in the marriage register of Carroll County, Mississippi recording his married to Jane Curry Bird, July 14, 1842. Their son, Spencer Young was born in Carroll County April 15, 1843. There were no other children born to Jesse and Jane. The fate of Jane Curry Bird is not known. Jesse Young remarried in 1846 so it is assumed that Jane Curry died sometime between 1843 and 1846.

The Carroll County marriage register indicates that Jesse Thomas Young married Eliza Ann Chambers (b 1824) on January 2, 1846. Eliza Ann Chambers was a daughter of Dr. William P. and Elizabeth Chambers. Jesse Young moved his family to Drew County, Arkansas around 1854. Tradition holds the family moved at about the time of a major Yellow Fever epidemic in Carroll County, Mississippi. The family settled in the southeast corner of Drew county not far from the Ashley county line in a community settled by his father-in-law Dr. Chambers. The community became known as Line. Other communities of interest were Old Troy and new Troy.

In November of 1856, Jesse Young was ordained as Preacher of the Gospel by the congregation of the Disciples of Jesus Christ meeting at Mytiline. The credential document was signed by W. P. Chambers and was eventually filed for record at Drew County on November 25, 1871. Jesse Young continued as a preacher until a few weeks before his death in 1914.

Jesse Thomas Young remarried in 1859, the fate of Eliza is unknown. There is no record of her burial in the New Troy cemetery where Jesse Thomas Young is buried.

Drew County, Arkansas marriage records (book B, page 54) lists the marriage of Jesse Thomas Young age 37 to Mary Francis Nealy, age 28 on August 3, 1859.

A James T. is included in the roster of Company L of the Third Regiment of the Arkansas Volunteers, organized at Latonia, Ashley county on July 1, 1861. Some sources have attributed this enlistment to Jesse Thomas Young (age 38 at that time). However there was in fact, a James T. Young age 24 residing in West Carroll parish LA just to the south of Ashley county AR. It seems certain that it was this James rather than Jesse who enlisted in Company L. It is interesting to note that James T. Young's father was named Spencer. See the Research page for more information on this second Spencer Young and his possible relationship to Jesse Thomas Young.

On December 7, 1878 Jesse, age 56, married his fourth wife, Susan Gabbert, probably age 37. Susan Gabbert's brother Michael married Jesse's daughter Cordellia in 1882.

Most of his life, Jesse Thomas Young's occupation was listed in census records as farmer and at times, preacher. Around 1900 at an age of 77, his occupation began to be listed as physician. He apparently became a country doctor for the rural community of Line in south Drew county Arkansas. It is interesting to note the influence Dr. W. P. Chambers had on Jesse Young. Literally following his mentor's footsteps from Mississippi to Arkansas, Jesse Young became first a preacher then a country doctor.

In 1911, Edward died suddenly and at age 89, Jesse helped to raise Edward's children.

Jesse Thomas Young died in Drew county Arkansas, September 16, 1914 at age 92 and was buried in the New Troy cemetery. His grave is marked with the title Doctor Jesse Thomas Young.

The following is given by a descendant, Ronald E. Bullock (available at <http://www.daytex.com/line.htm> as of Dec 2004).

My Mother, Essie Naron, was born in the community of Line, AR, on the boundary of Drew and Ashley Counties in Jan of 1911. There is hardly anything at all there at present to show that it was once a rather prosperous farming community, except for some sizable nearby cemeteries. My Mom's great-grandfather, Jesse T. Young (1822-1914), was a country doctor and preacher in Line. She can still remember sitting in his lap and having his long, white beard tickle her face when she was not quite four. He is said to have ridden his horse to church and preached on the morning in which he died suddenly that afternoon at age 92.

Elizabeth Hedge, b. in Yarmouth, Mass., May 21, 1647; d. in Plymouth, Dec. 15, 1731; dau. of Capt. William (d. 1670) and first wife. Jonathan Barnes, b. June 3, 1643; d. in Plymouth, Aug. 20, 1714; son of John and Mary (Plummer), who were m. Sept. 12, 1633. Mary d. in Plymouth, June 2, 1651, and her husband, John Barnes, d. 1671.

Abiel Shurtleff was born soon after the untimely death of his father and there was a considerable debate as to what his name should be. By some it was thought that he should be called after Boanerges (Children of Thunder), as mentioned in the New Testament; but the difficulty of converting the plural name into the singular number fortunately prevailed against the infliction of an appellation which was far from being euphonious. The scriptural name Abiel, which interpreted into English from the Hebrew, signifies "God, my father," was adopted as the most satisfactory, since it was sufficiently indicative of his posthumous birth. Mr. Shurtleff was a very noted "housewright," as was his father, and built "all the meeting houses in his time." He dwelt during the greater part of his life at Plymouth, living in the "Tim Goodwin" house and in the one next to it, which he also owned. Perhaps these were the two adjoining houses which were once one house owned by Mr. Shurtleff and in which all of his children were born. He was a useful man in his town, holding various offices, and was one of the selectmen there in 1715, '16, '17, '18, '19 and 1720. Late in life he removed with his family to that part of Plympton which is now called Carver and built him a house, the cellar of which may still be seen in the "Old Will" field, about 110 rods from the house now standing on his old estate, but is nearly filled in with earth and looks like a mere depression in the ground. Near it is an apple tree which Mr. Shurtleff set out. The trunk of this tree is hollow with one side entirely gone, and is so covered with a sucker growth that at a distance it looks like a young, unpruned tree. His estate here consisted of some six hundred acres and was located between "Barne's Bridge" over the Wewantitt River, and Pope's Point. On one occasion his brother William came to spend the evening with him, leaving his horse in charge of a nephew, who turned him loose in the field. About 9 or 10 o'clock this nephew, Benjamin, when he went to catch the horse, found a wildcat in a trap which he had set for that purpose. Upon moving to Plympton Abiel Shurtleff gave his house in Plymouth to his son James and the "Tim Goodwin" house to his youngest son, Abiel. He was a paralytic for many years previous to his death, and when about fifty years of age had a shock of the palsy and kept his bed much of the time. After six years' residence in the new home he lost his wife, and he survived her but five years. This house was afterwards cut in two and one part moved away by his grandson, Daniel Vaughan, and the remainder was taken down by his son, David Shurtleff. As already said under No. 2, Abiel Shurtleff and wife were buried in the Lakenham graveyard.

Upon the death of the father in 1732, Joseph and Abiel, the two youngest children, appointed their cousin Barnabas Shurtleff to be their guardian.

In 1701 Abiel Shurtleff bought of Abraham Jackson 30 acres of upland and four acres of meadow at the South Meadows bounded by Pollipody Cove; May 21, 1702, he bought of Caleb Loring 10 acres of upland which was granted at a town meeting held at Plymouth, Feb. 9, 1663, to William Harlow, by virtue of his having meadow at lower South Meadows; June 15, 1703, he bought of Eleazer Ring four acres of meadow at Pollipody Cove at the South Meadows given him by his father, Andrew Ring; June 30, 1703, he bought of George Morton 10 acres of upland granted by virtue of his having meadow at the upper South Meadows, and 21/2 acres of meadow adjoining the same; in 1704 he bought of Joseph and Daniel Pratt four acres of meadow at South Meadows; July 12, 1708, he bought of Jacob Tomson, Joseph Vaughan and Samuel Wood 40 acres in Plympton bounded by Beaver Dam Pond; Dec. 23, 1708, he bought of his brother William what has already been mentioned under No. 2; Feb. 12, 1708/9, he bought of Thomas Howland a lot of land in Plymouth; Mar. 31, 1709, he bought of Benajah Pratt 10 acres of upland at the South Meadows; June 28, 1709, he bought of William Ring 10 acres of upland at the South Meadows; May 14, 1716, he bought of Benajah Pratt his share, one-tenth part, of grant made by town of Plymouth of swamp land at a place in Plympton called Swan Hole, and on the same day bought of Nathaniel Holmes 29 acres of land at the South Meadows; July 20, 1716, he bought of Samuel Savery 30 acres of land; Sept. 22, 1716, he bought of Daniel Pratt 58 1/2 acres of land.

Several lots of land which he owned in Plymouth are described by Davis in his "Ancient Landmarks" as follows: "The first two lots on Main street, west side, covered by a block of two stores (recently burned), were formerly owned by

the Bradfords. The land extending from that point to the southerly line of the Davis Hall lot, and westerly to School Street, as far back as the records reach, belonged to William and Joseph Bradford, sons of Gov. Bradford, and was sold by them in 1697 to Nathaniel Howland. On Aug. 20, 1697, he sold it to Abiel Shurtleff, there being one acre of land. The lot on which the building stands owned by Mr. Bailey was sold to Ephraim Cobb. The next lot, on which the building stands owned by Mr. Hall (deceased) was conveyed, like the preceding one, to Mr. Cobb. While in the possession of Abiel Shurtleff he built a house on it in which he lived. Mr. Cobb and Nathaniel Torrey also occupied the house after him and John Bartlett occupied it many years as an inn, bearing the name of 'The Bunch of Grapes.' The lot next to this, on which the house stands owned by Mr. Gooding and others, remained a vacant lot during its ownership by the Bradfords, Howland and Shurtleff, and after Abiel's death came into the possession of his son, James Shurtleff, who built the house which was the residence for many years of the late John Gooding. The next lot, on which the house stands owned by Miss Simmons, likewise came to James Shurtleff, who in 1749 sold it to his brother Joseph, who built the house now standing and occupied it as a residence. The next lot, on which the Old Colony National Bank building stands, came in the same way to Abiel Shurtleff and while in his possession Joshua Morse built, in 1717, the house which was torn down to make way for the bank building. The next lot to this, on which the Plymouth National Bank building stands, was sold by Mr. Shurtleff to Caleb Loring. The gore of land between Summer Street and Mill Lane was held by the town as common land until 1709, when it was granted to Abiel Shurtleff and James Barnaby on the condition that they and their assigns should keep Summer Street, then called Mill Street, in good repair and safe for travel. In 1716 they sold a part of the gore to Robert Bartlett. The remainder, 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet in length, was sold by them in 1710 to Richard Cooper and Francis Adams, they agreeing to fulfill the conditions of the grant by keeping the street in front of the land purchased by them in repair. The estate known in later years as Hayward's orchard, formerly included a part of the ministerial land and land granted by the town in 1711 and 1714 to John Wood and Abiel Shurtleff. He once owned land on Watson's Hill lying south of a line drawn through Jefferson Street. Between that line and the northerly line of the estate of De Forest Shaw, on that part of Pleasant Street once called Jordan Street, lies a tract of land extending westerly to the pond and measuring nine acres. The easterly part of this tract, bounding on Training Green on the east and reaching the westerly line of the house lots on Mayflower Street, is the allotment of six acres made to Stephen Hopkins in the first division of lands in 1623. The westerly part is the allotment of three acres made to Samuel Fuller, Jr., in the same division. In 1634 Mr. Fuller sold his land to Josiah Cook, and in 1638 Mr. Hopkins also sold his to Mr. Cook, who in 1645 sold these nine acres of land to Giles Rickard. On Mar. 22, 1698/9, Giles Rickard of a later generation sold these nine acres to Abiel Shurtleff, and stated in his deed that they were given to him by his grandfather. In 1713 Mr. Shurtleff sold this land to William Barnes."
