1. **Douglass Van Buren STONE** "Doug" was born 28 May 1924 in Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died 17 Aug 2000 in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried 19 Aug 2000 in Hamburg Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Douglass Van Buren Stone was born 28 May 1924 in Ashley County, Arkansas. He was the only (surviving) male child of Robert and Ruth Stone.

Doug married Grace Shurtleff on 23 January 1943 in Snyder, Ashley Co., Arkansas. They continued to live in the Bearhouse Township area, near Doug's parents.

In October, 1969, Doug started serving as the Director of Music for the Northside Baptist Church in Monticello. He held this position for more than 15 years. He also served as Sunday School director for 11 years, served as secretary for the Board of Deacons, and served as a member of the Bartholomew Baptist Association Executive Board. Doug was also very active in Gideons International.

Around 1986 Douglass and Grace moved to Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Doug developed Parkinson's disease which became increasingly debilitating through the 1990s. Grace lovingly cared for him through this trying time. Doug passed away on 17 August 2000, and is buried in the Hamburg Cemetery, Arkansas.

Douglass V. B. Stone, 76, of Hamburg died on Thursday, Aug. 17, 2000, at the Beverly Health Care Center in Hamburg. Stone was a native of Ashley County, a former resident of Monticello and a resident of Hamburg for the past 16 years. He retired from the Drew County Road Department in 1986, and he was a deacon of the First Baptist Church in Hamburg. He was a Gideon, a Mason and a member of the Woodmen of the World. He was preceded in death by his parents, Robert M. and Ruth Mason Douglass Stone, and two sisters, Blanche White and Robbie Fleming.

Survivors include his wife, Grace Shurtleff Stone of Hamburg; a son, Robert E. Stone and his wife Fran of Crossett; a daughter, Joyce Hussey and her husband, J. C.; a sister, Anna Ruth Kelley and her husband, Hershel; three grandchildren Robert D. Stone and his wife Susan of Crossett, Robinan Gentry and her husband Derrick of Monroe, La., and James R. Shell and his wife Donna of Washington, DC; and five great-grandchildren.

Funeral was on Saturday at the First Baptist Church in Hamburg, with Dr. Bobby Pennington and the Rev. Klois Hargis officiating. 2. **Robert Marion STONE** "Bob" was born² 17 Nov 1893 in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was baptized³ 22 Sep 1907 in Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died 29 May 1982 in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried 30 May 1982 in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas. Bob married⁴ Ruth Mason DOUGLASS on 13 Mar 1915 in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas.



Robert or Bob to some was born 17 November 1893 in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He was the first of fourteen children born to Jackson and Anna. Robert was named after his uncle, Jackson's younger brother, who had died five years before at the early age of 18. This continues an honoring of a previous generation "Robert" who met an untimely death. (Robert Marion Stone's uncle was in fact named after HIS uncle--Robert, son of Rauley and Tabitha Stone, who in 1863 was killed while serving in the Confederate Army with the 18th Alabama Infantry, Company G).

Robert would grow up and spend much of his life in Bearhouse Township where he is noted as living with his parents in the 1900 and 1910 census. He attended Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Berea, where he likely met Ruth Mason Douglass.

Robert and Ruth were married in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas on 15 March 1915 by R. L. Griswold, J. P.; this was the first wedding performed by Griswold. They were married "sitting in a buggy in Rube Griswold's yard" [65th wedding anniversary announcement]. At the time of their marriage they were allegedly living in only a "tent" [Anna Ruth Stone Kelley]. For the first two and a half years after their marriage, Robert worked at the Gates Camp saw mill in Midway, Drew Co., Arkansas, just across the county border [50th Anniversary Announcement, Anna Ruth Stone Kelley]. They resided in Midway during this time, as indicated from Robert's 1917 WW I Registration Card. From the card, Robert's physical description is given as "tall and slender" with "blue eyes and brown hair."

Robert and Ruth had their first child in 1916 (Blanche), followed by an infant who died at birth in 1918. Sometime during 1918 Robert and Ruth moved back to Bearhouse Township, Ashley County, near Robert's parents. The 1920 census indicates a female boarder, age 47, by the name of Arrington, was also living with them. In 1920 Robert and Ruth's third child, Robbie, was born, followed in 1925 by their fourth child Douglass. Robert and Ruth had their last child, Anna Ruth, in 1935.

About 1931 Robert began driving a school bus, busing kids from Berea to Hamburg. He would continue this job for more than 40 years, and all the kids growing up in Berea would come to know him. In addition to driving the bus, Robert farmed and raised livestock.

In 1961 Robert and Ruth moved to 202 West Washington St. in Hamburg [65th anniversary announcement]. At this time they had each been members of Mt. Olive Baptist Church for more than 50 years. After moving to town, they joined First Baptist Church.

Robert passed away on 29 May 1982, and is buried at the Mt. Olive Cemetery.

Obituary

Mr. Robert M. Stone, 88, of Hamburg, died Saturday, May 29, 1982 at Crossett. Mr. Stone was a native of Ashley County, a retired farmer and a member of Hamburg First Baptist Church. Mr. Stone was a deacon in the Hamburg First Baptist Church, a member of the Woodman of the World and had drove a school bus for the Hamburg School District for over 40 years.

He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Mrs. Ruth Douglas Stone; a son, Douglas Stone of Monticello; two daughters, Ann Ruth Kelley and Robbie Fleming, both of Hamburg; two brothers, James Stone of Hamburg, and Henry Stone of Pine Bluff; seven sisters, Mrs. Lula McKinney of Crossett, Mr. Gladys Boykin of Malvern, Mrs. Agnes Adair of Snyder, Mrs. Alma Bailey of Monticello, Mrs. Vonnie Bailey of Wilmar, Mrs. Irene Smith of Monticello, Mrs. Anna Rawley of Pine Bluff; eight grandchildren and thirteen great grandchildren.

Funeral services were on Sunday, May 30, 1982, 3 p.m. at the Hamburg First Baptist Church with the Dr. Tommy Cunningham and Rev. Raymond Carpenter officiating. Ruth D. Stone

Mrs. Ruth Douglass Stone, 90, of Hamburg died at 4:45 a.m. Wednesday, September 17, 1986, at the Ashley Memorial Hospital in Crossett. Mrs. Stone was a native of Kosciusko, Miss., and a member of the First Baptist Church in Hamburg. She was the widow of Robert M. Stone.

Mrs. Stone was born August 23, 1896, to the late Willie and Mary Douglass and lived in Mississippi until she was two years old. The family then moved to Texas, moving back to Arkansas by covered wagon when she was seven years old.

At age 19, she married Robert Marion Stone of Hamburg. They had been married 67 years when Mr. Stone died 4 1/2 years ago. They were the parents of four children: Blanche, Robbie, Douglass and Anna Ruth.

Mrs. Stone is survived by one son, Douglass Stone, and one daughter, Anna Ruth Kelley, both of Hamburg. Other survivors include one sister, Elsie Riviere of Hot Springs; eight grandchildren, Kathryn Shell, Bobby Ferguson, Robert Stone and Marion Kelley of Hamburg, Joyce Hussey of Berryville, Curtis White of Benton, Scott Kelley of Fort Worth, Texas, and Harolyn Ann Stevenson of Tulsa, Oklahoma; and 14 greatgrandchildren, Carrie and Robert White; Sonny, Holley and Joseph Stevenson; Robert Douglass and Robinan Stone, Kendrah and Kassey Ferguson; Kayla, Farrah Lynn and Jim Bob Shell, and Angela and Marion Kelley. She is also survived by three sons-in-law, Rev. Harold White, Hurshel Kelley and Woody Fleming, and one daughter-in-law, Grace Stone.

Funeral services were Thursday, September 18, 1986 at 2 p. m. in the first Baptist Church in Hamburg with the Revs. Bobby Pennington, Harold White and James Hickman officiating. 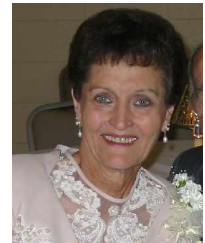
Obituary from the July 27, 1978 edition of the Ashley County Ledger:

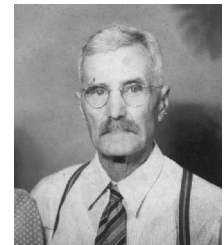

4. **Jackson Van Buren STONE** was born¹¹ 17 Nov 1870 in Arkansas. He died¹² 22 Sep 1968¹³ in Crossett, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas. Jackson married^{14,15} Anna Elizabeth Fidelia RILEY on 29 Jan 1893 in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas.



Jackson was born 17 November 1870 and was the eighth of William "Bill" and Artimisa "Jane" Stone. However, four of the previous children did not live past age five. Jackson was likely born in Carter Township, Ashley Co., Arkansas, around five miles southeast of Hamburg where his parents were known to reside five months prior to his birth [1870 Census]. It appears that Jackson Van Buren Stone was named after his uncle, Rev. Jackson Van Buren Waldrop (his mother's brother).

In 1880, at age 9, the family was still in Carter Township. Also this year Jackson's father would die, leaving his mother Jane with seven children in the home. In 1888, Jackson's older brother, Robert Marion, would die just before his 19th birthday. Jackson and Robert were less than two years in age apart and likely close, as Jackson would later name his firstborn son after him. Jackson's mother, Jane, died in 1890 just before his 20th birthday. After her death, it is noted that 80 acres of land which was in Jane's name was jointly conveyed to Jackson and his younger brother William Norman (T17S, R62, S33, N½SW). This land is located southeast of Hamburg, about 5.5 miles out on Hwy 8, then ¾ of a mile to the south (reference the map in William B. Stone's scrapbook section of the electronic report). The land patent was likely filed in 1890 soon after Jane's death, but was not officially granted until 1892.

In 1893, Jackson would marry Anna Riley, and the union resulted in fourteen children, with twelve living to adulthood. Their marriage was announced in the February 2nd, 1893, edition of the Ashley County Eagle which proclaimed "Jackson Stone and Miss Annie Riley were married by Rev. W. T. Adams recently." Their first child was born later in 1893, Robert Marion, and would be named after Jackson's younger brother Robert Marion, who had died in 1888. Jackson and Anna's firstborn daughter, Julia Fidelia Stone, would be named after Anna's mom, who died eleven days after giving birth to Anna.

At the time of or soon after their marriage, it is thought that Jackson and Anna moved to Berea to 80 acres given to them by Anna's father, Jim Riley [Anna Stone interview, March 2005]. Jackson and Anna were certainly in Berea by July 1895, as this is when Jackson became a member of Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Berea "by letter." Anna would become a member a year later in July 1896 by "experience and baptism" [Mt. Olive records, p. 73]. It is thought that

Anna's father, Jim Riley, gave them 80 acres of land in Berea. (Incidentally, the move to Berea may also be correlated with a tornado that came through the original Stone land southeast of Hamburg on 14 February 1893. The tornado destroyed the home of Jackson's brother, John Benton, as well as killing John's wife and seriously injuring three of his children. John's home site was within half a mile of Jackson's land.)

The 1900 census indicates the family was residing in Bearhouse Township, Ashley Co., Arkansas. In May 1911, Jackson was elected deacon of Mt. Olive Baptist Church and was ordained a month later [ibid, p. 110]. In 1923 their youngest child, Anna Winnimae, was born when Jackson was 52 and Anna 45. On 25 January 1925 Jackson and family were granted letters leaving Mt. Olive Baptist Church [ibid, p. 130]. At this time the family moved to a Gates' logging camp near Wilmar, Drew Co., Arkansas. The stay there was short, for soon after they went to "Crossett logging camp" [Anna Stone, March 2005 interview]. Jackson helped build some of the first houses for the Crossett Lumber Company [Gladys Stone Boykin]. (Note that the move to Gates Camp may have been to a location near the Crossett Camp in Ashley county--it is known that the Gates Camp moved into the Crossett Camp from Wilmar in 1925-26, [Reflections of Ashley County, p. 170]).

In 1929, the family returned to Bearhouse Township, Ashley County, and purchased land from William Jephtha Douglass, who was the father-in-law of two of Jackson's children [Anna Stone interview, Gladys Stone Boykin article]. This land was around 1/2 mile south of the Mt. Olive Church. (According to Jackson's granddaughter, Anna Ruth Stone Kelley, this land was never owned by Jackson, but was eventually owned by Jackson's son, Robert Marion Stone). It was at the Douglass place that the family was residing for the 1930 census. It is also noted from the 1930 census that their first son, Robert Marion, is living near them with wife Ruth and three children. Jackson and Anna resided on this property until around 1944 or 1945, when they moved a few miles to the southeast to Snyder, Ashley Co., Arkansas [Anna Stone, Anna Ruth Stone Kelley]. Shortly before their move to Snyder, Jackson and Anna moved to Booneville, Arkansas. They were in Booneville for around six months and stayed with Anna's first cousin, Dr. Jesse Dean Riley, who was superintendent of the state sanatorium there. Jackson did carpentry work during their stay in Booneville. Returning to Snyder, they owned a home immediately to the west of Snyder cemetery, living there until just before Anna died in 1954 [Gladys Stone Boykin].

Jackson was widowed on 4 January 1954 with the death of Anna. Jackson died 9 years later on 22 September 1968 in Ashley Co. less than two months before his 99th birthday. His longevity surpassed that of his grandfather, Rauley Stone, who had died in 1892 in Alabama at more than 90 years old. Jackson was buried in the Mount Olive Cemetery, Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Jackson was known to comment on how he would love to travel back to Alabama and learn more about the Stone family history [Anna Stone].

Obituary from the Sept. 26, 1968 edition of the Ashley County Ledger:

Services For Jackson Stone Held Monday

Jackson Van Buren Stone, aged 97, of Snyder died in a Crossett hospital Sunday, September 22. Mr. Stone was one of the last surviving pioneer citizens of Ashley county. He had lived most of his life in the Mt. Olive community, north of Hamburg, and was a retired farmer. He was a Baptist.

Mr. Stone is survived by three sons, Robert and James Stone, Hamburg; Henry Stone, Pine Bluff; nine daughters, Mrs. Fedelia Douglas, Dermott; Mrs. Lula McKinney, Crossett; Mrs. Alma Bailey, Mrs. Helen Trimm and Mrs. Irene Smith, Monticello; Mrs. Vonnie Bailey, Wilmar; Mrs. Gladys Boykin, Malvern; Mrs. Agnes Adair, Snyder; Mrs. Ann Rowley, Atlanta, Ga.; forty grandchildren, fiftyseven great grandchildren and eleven great, great grandchildren.

Funeral services were at 2:30 P. M. Monday in the First Baptist Church, Hamburg, by the Revs. E. E. Griever, Klois Hargis, Jerry Selby and Harold White.

5. **Anna Elizabeth Fidelia RILEY**¹⁶ was born¹⁷ 26 Jan 1878 in Arkansas. She died⁷ 4 Jan 1954 in Crossett, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Anna's mother, Julia, died only five days after she was born, presumably from complications related to the birth. Anna's second middle name, Fidelia, is thought to have been given to her as a memorial to her mother (whose middle name was Fidelia). From the 1880 census, it is seen that Anna is in the household of her grandfather, James Cooper RILEY in Bearhouse, Ashley Co., AR. Her father, James Nathan RILEY is living in a nearby house by himself.

Anna died of cancer (Joyce G. STONE).

Mrs. J. V. B. Stone, aged 75, lifelong resident of Ashley county, died in the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. I. Burchfield in Crossett Monday, January 4.

Mrs. Stone and her husband, who survives lived most of their lives in the Mount Olive community, north of Hamburg, and were from members of the earliest Ashley county families. The couple, who have 12 living descendants, had children attending Ashley county Schools for 40 continuous years. She was one of the oldest members of the Mt. Olive Baptist Church.

Those surviving are her husband; three sons, Robert Stone and James Stone, Hamburg, Henry Stone, Monticello; nine daughters, Mrs. T. D. Douglas, West Memphis, Mrs. C. I. Burchfield, Crossett, Mrs. John Bailey, Little Rock, Mrs. Jim Bailey, Wilmar, Mrs. J. C. Wisner, Wilmot, Mrs. Zack Boykin, Malvern, Mrs. Henry Smith, Monticello, Mrs. Thomas Adair, Snyder and Mrs. Cecil Rowley, Silver Springs, Md., one brother, Ira Riley, Hamburg and one sister, Mrs. Velma Clark, Hamburg.

Forty-six grandchildren and 24 great grandchildren also survive.

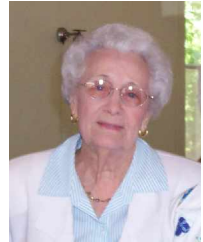

6. **William Jeptha DOUGLASS** "Willie"⁵ was born¹³ 21 Oct 1870 in Leake Co., Mississippi. He died 4 Jan 1931 in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried⁹ in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas. Willie married Mary Etta TURNER on 7 May 1891 in Center, Attala Co., Mississippi.

William J. Douglass was born 21 Oct 1871 in Leake Co., Mississippi, and was the first of fourteen children to be born to Eli and Saletha "Letie" Douglass. In 1880 he is noted as residing with his parents in Leake, Co.

According to Elsie (the youngest daughter), William Jeptha Douglass and Mary Etta Turner married in Kosciusko MS (or in Leake County), in May of 1891, where they had their first child and then moved to Texas, living in Rains Co., TX, from about 1893 until early 1904. Mary Etta referred to the Texas interlude with disdain, calling it "a sojourn in hell." She had her seventh child in late 1903, and made the move to Arkansas with six children and a tiny baby who died shortly after their arrival in Ashley County. (A. Milton Riviere research notes, Dec 2004, e-mail)

In November 1904, William and Mary joined Mt. Olive Baptist church "by letter" and left the church in September 1905 also "by letter." They rejoined Mt. Olive by letter from Midway Baptist Church in June of 1910, along with children Thad and Stella. Children Ruth and Leatie would both join in 1911 by "experience and baptism." (Mt. Olive records, pp. 70, 109).

In 1908 William bought property (91 acres) from H. E. Cotham in the Berea community northeast of Hamburg. They lived there until 1929 when they moved to Monticello and lived for a while with Horace and Elsie. Needing to sell the property, William resisted an offer by Elsie and Horace, choosing rather to sell to the Crossett Lumber Company, later to become part of Georgia-Pacific. All the land that he owned and farmed was returned to timber production, as was all the land of his neighbors in Berea. (A. Milton Riviere research notes, Dec 2004, e-mail)

8. **William Benton STONE** "Bill"¹⁸ was born 19 Dec 1830 in South Carolina. He died 22 Oct 1880 in Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried⁹ in Cleveland Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas. Bill married^{25,26} Artemisse Jane WALDROP on 14 Feb 1853 in Tuscaloosa Co., Alabama.

Born in South Carolina in 1830, Bill moved with his parents "Rolly" and "Tabby" to Jefferson Co., Alabama by abt. 1835. In Aug 1847 at age 17 William STONE joined Mud Creek Baptist Church in Jefferson Co., AL by expression of faith. His parents were also members of the church as were many of his siblings. (His parents were member of the church from Jul 1845-May 1858). In 1850 he was living with his parents in Mud Creek, Jefferson Co., AL. In Feb 1853 Bill married Jane WALDROP and by 1859 when they had their third child, David STONE, they had moved to Ashley Co., Arkansas. An 1860 land patent shows a homestead entry by Bill of 80 acres (SEW and SWNE of S33, T17s, R6W), located 5.5 miles southeast of Hamburg on the south side of Hwy 8.

William's younger sister, Sarah, married his wife's (Jane's) younger brother, Rev. Jackson Van Buren WALDROP. Jackson and Sarah would also go to Ashley Co., Arkansas, as well as Jane's father, Samuel. (The Rev. Jackson Van Buren WALDROP was minister at Central Baptist Church in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas from bef Jul 1883 to abt Apr 1887).

In 1860 Bill and Jane resided in Beech Creek Township, Ashley Co., AR., with their land valued at \$400 and their personal property valued at \$250. In 1870 and 1880 they were living in Carter Township, Ashley Co., AR. In 1870 their land was valued at \$80, and their personal property at \$300.

The name of "Bill" is given on his headstone in Cleveland cemetery (Ashley County Cemetery listing, Ashley Co. Ledger). He is buried with his wife, Jane (Artemissa Jane WALDROP). The Cleveland Cemetery is located adjacent to Arkansas Highway 8, 5.5 miles east of the intersection of Highway 8 and U.S. 425 in Hamburg (North 33 11.312 West 91 42.837). Gravesite visited by Robert E. STONE and son Robert D. STONE abt. 2000.

9. **Artemisse Jane WALDROP** "Jane"¹⁸ was born²⁷ 7 Nov 1834 in Short Creek, Jefferson Co., Alabama. She died 1 Sep 1890 in Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried⁹ in Cleveland Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Alternate first name spellings exist, Artemisse chosen from land patent document to children. Middle name, Jane, given on headstone.

Aug 1871: joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church by "experience and baptism" (Mt. Olive records, p. 31).

Apr 1873: member of the "Sabbath School" at Mt. Olive Baptist Church (Mt. Olive records, p. 34a). (thought to be him, listed as "J. L. Riley").

Sep 1877: brought before the church as not "having fellowship" with fellow brother John Wheat (Mt. Olive records, p. 45).

May 1878: it appears the conflict between the Riley's and the Wheat's is resolved (Mt. Olive records, p. 47).

Aug 1882: chosen as a church delegate to the association (Mt. Olive records, p. 54).

Appears that Jim was a member of Mt. Olive through at least 1927.

According 1880 US Census, he was a widower (age 25 at the time). Occupation was farmer, resident location in 1880: Bearhouse, Ashley, Arkansas.

11. **Julia Fidelia TAYLOR**¹⁶ was born¹⁷ 1 Feb 1859 in Mississippi. She died 7 Feb 1878 in Arkansas and was buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Julia was born in 1859 soon after her family's move from Mississippi. For the 1860 census her parents resided in Bearhouse Township, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Julia died only eleven days after giving birth to Anna, presumably from complications with the birth.

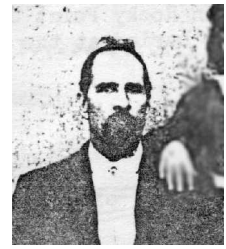

In 1870 Luke, age 43, and Virginia (STONE) TURNER, age 32, were living in Beat 5, Neshoba Co., Mississippi. His land was valued at \$200 and his personal property at \$160. Seven of their children are living with them at this time. It is noted that Virginia's younger brother, Andrew J. STONE was a neighbor.

In 1880 the family was residing in Beat 1 of Leake Co., Mississippi. Seven children were in the home at this time, from Jeesey, age 2 to Ira, age 18.

15. **Virginia Texas STONE**⁵ was born³³ 6 Jul 1837 in Georgia. She died³³ 19 Aug 1901 in Kosciusko, Attala Co., Mississippi and was buried³⁵ in Center Cemetery, Attala Co., Mississippi.

Middle name of "Texas" given from A. Milton Riviere (Dec 2004).

They had the following children:

- F i. **Martha J. TURNER** was born²³ about 1858 in Mississippi.
Likely named after her aunt--Virginia's older sister, Martha J. Stone Lee.
- F ii. **Nancy V. TURNER** "Sissy" was born^{23,33} 7 Aug 1861 in Mississippi. She died 19 Nov 1906 and was buried³³ 1906 in Rockey Point Cemetery, Leake Co., Mississippi.
- M iii. **Ira Anderson TURNER**³⁵ was born^{5,34} 6 Mar 1862 in Center, Attala Co., Mississippi. He died⁵ 4 Jul 1937 in Leake Co., Mississippi.
Estimated birth year of 1862 from the 1880 census of parents (conflicts with date given by Riviere).
Birth year of 1862 also given in 1900 census.
- F iv. **Lucy E. TURNER** was born⁵ 31 Jan 1864 in Leake Co., Mississippi. She died⁵ 10 Mar 1939 in Leake Co., Mississippi.
Likely named after her maternal grandmother, Lucy Akers Stone.
- M v. **William J. TURNER** was born¹⁷ about 1867 in Mississippi.
- M vi. **Ephraim F. TURNER** was born^{5,34} Feb 1868 in Center, Attala Co., Mississippi.
- 7 F vii. **Mary Etta TURNER** was born 28 May 1870 and died 7 Nov 1933.
- F viii. **Parry Zadie TURNER** was born⁵ about 1873 in Mississippi.
- M ix. **Jessey M. TURNER** was born⁵ about 1877 in Mississippi.
- x. **Unknown TURNER**³⁴.

Fifth Generation

16. **Rauley STONE**³⁶ was born about 1801 in South Carolina. He died³⁷ 27 Jan 1892 in Razburg, Jefferson Co., Alabama and was buried³⁶ in Mud Creek Baptist Church Cemetery #2, Jefferson Co., Alabama. Rauley married Tabitha PARSONS in South Carolina.

Rauley STONE was born about 1801 in South Carolina, and married Tabitha "Tabby" PARSONS in South Carolina sometime prior to 1827. Between 1831 and 1836 Rolly and Tabby, along with four children, made their way to Jefferson Co., Alabama, where at least three additional children would be born.

In 1839, two different land patents for 40 acres each would be issued to Rauley (SESE S7 T19-S R6-W and NENW S18 T19-S R6-W see the map with the scrapbook link in multimedia edition). It is presumed they settled on this land and this is where they would raise their family.

In July, 1845 Rauley and Tabitha became members of the Mud Creek Baptist Church (Jefferson Co, AL), where they were members until May 1858. Several of their children also joined the church, all when they were about 16 or 17 years old. The children, and the month when they joined the church are as follows: Amanda, Dec 1844; Lucinda, Feb 1845; Nancy, Mar 1845; William, Aug 1847; and Merritt, Sep 1852.

In 1850 Rauley's occupation is noted as "farmer" and their land was valued at \$300. Also living in the household in 1850, with their approximate age, were wife Tabby (52), and the following children: Nancy (22), Amanda (20), William (18), Merritt (14), Sarah (10) and Robert (8).

In May 1858, Rauley and Tabitha end their membership at Mud Creek Baptist Church. It is hypothesized that their membership there ended due to a move further to the west, as it is noted that in 1861 a land patent for an additional 240 acres was granted to Rauley (N½SE S12 T19-S R7-W and S½NE S12 T19-S R7-W). It was common for the patent to be issued some time after settling the land, and perhaps they moved to this land in 1858. (This new land was

an additional mile or so from Mud Creek Baptist Church, which was already a considerable distance from their first land settled ca. 1839).

Shortly after this time, their son William and daughter Sarah depart from Jefferson Co. AL with their spouses (who were also siblings) to settle in Ashley Co., Arkansas.

In 1860 Rauley and Tabby still resided in Jefferson Co, Alabama, in the Freeland Precinct. Only one child is living with them, Robert age 19. Also in the household were Lewis and Robert Burton, ages 16 and 14 (circumstance and relationship unknown). Five slaves are attributed to them in 1860: female, age 38; male, age 11; male, age 6; male, age 5; and female, age 4 (1860 Slave Schedule, Woods Precinct, Jefferson Co., AL).

The Civil War would take its toll on Rauley and Tabby. Their youngest son, Robert STONE, enlisted in the Confederate Army in Sep 1862 and served in the 18th Alabama Infantry, Company G. Robert died in the war less than a year from his enlistment date, about July 1863.

In 1870 Rauley and Tabby are living alone in the Mud Creek area (T19, R6) of Jefferson Co, Alabama. Only he and Tabby are in the household. His real estate is valued at \$200 and his personal property at \$250.

From "The Bessemer Journal" newspaper of February 4, 1892, a note written in by a subscriber states: "(Razburg) Old Uncle Stone, who is somewhere in the nineties, until five or six months ago, was exceedingly spry...But for the last few months his tottering and stooping form refers us to the fact that old age must terminate in death..." Two weeks later, under the death notices from "The Bessemer Journal" of February 18, 1892, the following is stated: "(Razburg, February 14) Uncle R. Stone passed quietly on January 27th, and left a goodly posterity to mourn his departure." So even the first article published on 4 Feb 1892 was already after his death.

A headstone, which is thought to be Rauley's, is found in Mud Creek Baptist Church Cemetery #2, Jefferson Co., Alabama. However, it states "R. STONE, Aged 80 years". It is thought that this is his headstone, in spite of the erroneous age. It was likely placed at a later date or by someone who did not know his actual age at death.

17. **Tabitha PARSONS** "Tabby"³⁶ was born about 1800 in South Carolina. She died after 1870.

The PARSONS were some of the original settlers of Jefferson Co., Alabama. In the 1870 census of Township 19, Range 6 of Jefferson Co. Alabama (where Tabby and Rolly were living), there are numerous PARSONS, presumably all descendants of Tabby's grandfather, Joseph PARSONS.

They had the following children:

- F i. **Lucinda STONE**³⁶ was born about 1827 in South Carolina.
- F ii. **Nancy STONE**³⁶ was born about 1828 in South Carolina.
- F iii. **Amanda STONE**³⁶ was born 19 Nov 1828 in South Carolina. She died 3 May 1887 in Jefferson Co., Alabama and was buried³⁸ in Mud Creek Baptist Church Cemetery #1, Jefferson Co., Alabama.

BURIAL: Amanda HOWTON on headstone (married William Carroll Howton on abt 7 Jan 1847).

8 M iv. **William Benton STONE** was born 19 Dec 1830 and died 22 Oct 1880.

- M v. **Merritt STONE**³⁶ was born about 1834 in Alabama.

Civil War Service, 26th Alabama Infantry Co. G.

Merritt Stone, Private, Born in Jefferson County, Alabama and resident there when he enlisted August 5, 1861. Discharged due to lung disease which damaged the right lung on December 15, 1862 at age 28.

- F vi. **Sarah Allie STONE**³⁶ was born 10 Jan 1838 in Alabama. She died³⁶ 4 Oct 1912 in Spearsville, Union Pa., Louisiana.

The birthdates of Sarah's children are taken from a WALDROP family bible in possession of Mrs. John M. Waldrop, Haile, LA.

The family must have moved to Arkansas sometime between Feb 1859 and April 1860 when their first child, Robert Marion was born. Like Sarah's brother Bill, Sarah also named their firstborn son after their youngest brother, who died in the Civil War. All their children were born in Arkansas.

M vii. **Robert STONE**³⁶ was born about 1841 in Alabama. He died 1863.

Died in the Civil War while serving in the 18th Alabama Infantry Co. G. He enlisted September 1862 at Camp Beulah, Mobile, Alabama and entered as a Private. His "Reference Card" states "See Manuscript No. 1628 for burial, Dated: 31 July 1863". Note that the 18th lost 300 of its 500 men at the Battle of Chickamauga, September 18-20, 1863, but apparently Robert died before that. A Private earned \$11 per month compared to \$80 per month for a Lieutenant.

Robert's body is thought to have not been returned to Jefferson Co. Alabama (Hueytown Historical Society).

18. **Samuel Robert WALDROP**³⁹ was born¹⁷ 10 Jul 1809 in North Carolina. He died⁴⁰ 7 Aug 1886 in Ashley Co., Arkansas. Samuel married^{40,41} Susannah HAMAKER on 12 Dec 1833 in Short Creek, Jefferson, Alabama.

-1850 -- In the 1850 Jefferson County, Alabama census, Samuel R., his wife Susan and 9 children were living in the Short Creek area of Jefferson County, Alabama. Samuel and Susan were both listed as 40 years old, and both born in North Carolina. The children were: Artimesa, 15; Francis M., 14; Jackson V. B., 13; Benton Z., 11; William L., 9; Elizabeth A., 8; Hester C., 6; Nancy F., 4; and Susan M.

-1858 -- He moved his family to Ashley County, Arkansas, about 1858 (Robert Waldrop, Hueytown Historical Society).

-1880 -- Listed in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Ark, Carter T/S for 1880 census. He was apparently widowed and living with his two daughters, Susan Madaline Loften and her children, and Hester Carolina, who was listed as single in the census.

19. **Susannah HAMAKER** "Susan"³⁹ was born⁴² 14 May 1809 in Stokes Co., North Carolina. She died⁴⁰ 7 May 1879 in Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Alternate spelling of Suanna noted.

BIOGRAPHY:

1860 -- She was listed as a resident in the census report in Ashley Co., AR, Hamburg P.O., Carter Twp., 1860.

1862 -- Her father, John Hamaker (70, PA) of Jefferson Co., Alabama, gave his daughter Susan (40, NC), wife of Samuel Waldrop (40, NC) of Aarkansas a gift of slaves on 13 June 1862 (Deed Book 12, Page 548 of Jefferson County, Alabama).

1870 -- Susannah also listed in the 1870 Ashley Co., AR census in Carter Twp. with her husband Samuel Robert Waldrop and children.

They had the following children:

9 F i. **Artemisse Jane WALDROP** was born 7 Nov 1834 and died 1 Sep 1890.

F ii. **Francis Marion WALDROP**³⁹ was born 18 Oct 1835 in Alabama.

Waldrop, Francis Marion "Marion"

Private—Enlisted in Co. B, 3rd Arkansas Infantry, at Berlin, Arkansas, June 9, 1861; killed in action at Bermuda Hundred, Virginia, June 16, 1864; born in Alabama, October 19, 1835; listed in Ashley county 1860 census; occupation farmer; bought land in Ashley county in 1860.

An 1860 land patent shows Francis acquiring 160 acres of land in Ashley Co., Arkansas.

M iii. **Rev. Jackson Van Buren WALDROP**³⁹ was born 2 Apr 1837 in Alabama. He died⁴³ 12 Feb 1915 and was buried⁴³ in Spearsville Cemetery, Union Pa., Louisiana.

Rev. Jackson Van Buren WALDROP and wife Sarah STONE came to Ashley Co AR from Jefferson Co., Alabama about the time when Sarah STONE's parents, Bill and Artimisa also came to Ashley Co. from Jefferson Co., Alabama.

Jackson is thought to have served in the Confederate Army in Co. G, 37th Arkansas Infantry as a private (OneWorldTree entry). {This has not been independently confirmed, Jim Shell}.

Jackson V. B. WALDROP was pastor at Central Baptist Church (in the Berea community, Ashley Co., Arkansas; 10 miles NE of Hamburg). The minutes from Central Baptist Church meetings from July 1883 to April 1887 record many of the services over which he presided. However, he may have minister there as early as 1870.

From 1892 to 1909 Jackson served as minister in Spearsville, Louisiana and from 1910-1913 in Hailey, Louisiana. From 1914-15 Jackson was known to be a minister in Lillie, Louisiana.

M iv. **Benton Zachariah WALDROP**³⁹ was born 12 Feb 1839 in Alabama.

M v. **William Lee WALDROP**³⁹ was born 1 Aug 1840 in Alabama. He died 1862 and was buried 9 May 1862 in Elmwood Cemetery, Shelby Co., Memphis, Tennessee.

-1860: resident of Ashley Co., Arkansas

-Likely that he died in the Civil War:

WALDROP, William L. - Co. D, Miller's Ark Inf Batt'n, CSA; buried 09 May 1862 at Elmwood Cemetery, Memphis, Shelby Co., TN (from Arkansas Civil War Soldiers and Sailors)

F vi. **Elizabeth Ann Hasseltine WALDROP**³⁹ was born 28 Dec 1841 in Alabama. She died³⁶ 13 Aug 1873.

F vii. **Hester Caroline WALDROP**³⁹ was born 7 Dec 1843 in Alabama. She died³⁶ 12 Dec 1921 and was buried⁹ in Pleasant Grove Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

In 1880 Hester was living with her father in Carter TS, Ashley Co. Arkansas.

F viii. **Nancy Henrietta WALDROP**³⁹ was born 15 Jan 1846 in Alabama. She died³⁶ 19 Jul 1857 in Alabama and was buried³⁶ Jul 1857 in Family Cemetery, Jefferson Co., Alabama.

F ix. **Susannah Manadaline WALDROP**³⁹ was born 14 Aug 1848 in Alabama. She died³⁶ 9 Aug 1885.

In 1880 Susannah was living in her father's home with her children (Carter TS, Ashley Co., Arkansas)

M x. **John Samuel Dunwooda WALDROP**³⁹ was born 28 Nov 1852.

20. **James Cooper RILEY**¹⁶ was born^{13,17} 1 Jan 1826 in South Carolina. He died 9 Apr 1882 in Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas. James married^{16,30} Elizabeth Ann DAVIS on 1 Jan 1851 in Hamburg, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

James Cooper Riley was born 1 Jan 1826 in South Carolina. The ancestry of James is not well established, but he is believed to be the son of Joseph Riley, born about 1790 in South Carolina. James is the second born of at least eight children who all made their way to Ashley Co. Arkansas. It is estimated that the Riley family departed South Carolina sometime after 1838, and spent a few years in Mississippi prior to making their way to Ashley County in the late 1840s or early 1850.

In 1850 James' occupation is listed as "Wagoner" from the census and he was residing in the household of Thomas and Elizabeth Denson and their children, along with several other boarders, in White Township, Ashley Co., Arkansas. Also in this household was Elizabeth Davis, who would become his wife on 1 Jan 1851 in Ashley Co., Arkansas.

In Nov 1851 Elizabeth gave birth to their first child, John, followed by the birth of twin boys in 1853 (James and William), James would only live to be 9 months, and William also died early at age 16. James and Elizabeth would have a total of twelve children, with five dying before reaching the age of 20.

In 1857 a land patent is recorded for 120 acres in the Bearhouse area (S27 W½SW T15S R6W and S28 NESE T15S R6W) which was followed by an 1859 patent for 40 acres (S27 NESW T15S R6W) and yet another in 1860 for 40 acres (SESW T15S R6W 27). (A map showing this land is available in the multi-media version of this report).

On 23 August 1862, James and Elizabeth joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church by "experience and baptism" [Mt. Olive records, p. 8]. The Mt. Olive church would become a focal point for the Riley's and their descendants. Several events from James' life and that of his descendants may be found in the meeting minutes of the Mt. Olive church. In

July 1867 James was elected as an alternate delegate to the church association [ibid, p. 21]. In June 1868 James was elected as a deacon with the ordination following in July 1868 [ibid, p. 23-24]. In August 1868 James was elected as a delegate to the church association [ibid, p. 24]. In March 1869 the church entrusted James with funds from the church, and in July 1869 he served on a committee to repair the church well [ibid, p. 25]. In September 1869 he was elected as an alternate delegate to the church association [ibid, p. 26]. He is shown as a member of the "Sabbath School" in April 1873 [ibid, p. 34a]. In June 1873 he served on the church committee to repair the well [ibid, p. 35]. The final entry from the Mt. Olive minutes which survive today records his responsibility for early work done in the church cemetery. They met on 10 August 1874 to construct a 10-rail fence and gate around the cemetery [ibid, p. 36].

From before 1860 to after 1880 the family resided in Bearhouse Township, Ashley Co., Arkansas. In 1860 the land was valued at \$1120 and his personal property at \$180. In 1870 seven of their children were living with them and the land was valued at \$1500 and personal property at \$800. James is listed as a "farmer" and his sons were working the farm. In 1880 six of their children were living with them, with Mary being the oldest and George the youngest. In addition, their granddaughter Anna E. Riley, and a paid laborer were in the household.

James' youngest son, George, would be 9 years old when James died on 9 April 1882. A total of four children under age 16 would be left to Elizabeth.

According to a great-grandson's obituary (Floyd H. Riley), James Cooper Riley "helped lay out the town of Hamburg."

21. **Elizabeth Ann DAVIS**¹⁶ was born^{16,17,34,44} 11 Nov 1833 in Mississippi. She died^{45,46} 7 Mar 1910 in Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried⁴⁶ 8 Mar 1910 in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

From the March 10, 1910, Ashley County Eagle:

"Mrs. Elizabeth Davis Riley, who was buried at Mount Olive Tuesday afternoon, was born in Tennessee on Nov. 11th, 1833, and was in her 77th year of age. She had continuous membership in Mt. Olive Baptist Church for fifty-one years. She was a grandmother and great-grandmother of one hundred children, and was one of the most pious and consecrated mothers in Israel, who ever lived in Ashley County."



Note that the accompanying photograph is only tentatively identified as Elizabeth Ann Davis. It was likely taken shortly before her death. The original is thought to be in possession of Helen Wells as of 2006, with this copy provided electronically by Perry Snell, Jr.

They had the following children:

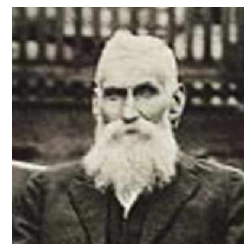
- M i. **John Rutledge RILEY**¹⁶ was born^{29,47} 12 Nov 1851 in Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died⁴⁸ 19 Apr 1927 in El Paso Co., Texas and was buried^{9,49} 24 Apr 1927 in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

John Rutledge Riley, Sr. was the oldest child of James and Elizabeth Riley. He was a Bible teacher at Mount Olive Baptist Church, and carefully prepared each Sunday's lesson. He frequently used "Pelubit's Notes" for his teaching preparation, and the next issue of this reference was always requested by him for a Christmas present.

John and his second wife Martha moved to Montrose for a time prior to moving to the El Paso, Texas, area in late 1926 with their children Dr. Jesse Dean Riley and Hattie. John would die in Texas, at the time of the 1927 floods, but his sons managed to go from Arkansas to western Texas and back over difficult roads to see that his body was brought back to Mount Olive Baptist Church for burial.

John is noted to have joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church in August, 1869. Over the next ten years the church minutes record some a few colorful entries showing his rebellious side with accusations of "drinking too much" and "profanity," which was always reconciled with John asking forgiveness of the congregation. John's membership at Mt. Olive ended in June 1912--it is hypothesized this is when he and Martha moved to Montrose.

Much of this biography is adapted from those by Blanche Riley Douglas and W. B. Riley, as recorded in "Reflections of Ashley County," pp. 372-373 and p. 374.



- M ii. **James Andrew RILEY**¹⁶ was born²⁹ 9 May 1853 in Arkansas. He died 3 Jan 1854.

- 10 M iv. **James Nathaniel RILEY** was born 16 Jan 1855 and died 12 May 1940.
- F v. **Mary Ann RILEY**¹⁶ was born⁵⁰ 4 Apr 1857 in Ashley Co., Arkansas. She died^{9,51} 25 May 1930 in Ft. Hill, Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried^{16,52} 26 May 1930 in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

July 1870: joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church by "experience and baptism" (Mt. Olive records, p. 28).
Apr 1873: member of the "Sabbath School" at Mt. Olive Baptist Church (Mt. Olive records, p. 34a).

- M vi. **Joseph Holmes RILEY** "Joe"¹⁶ was born⁵³ 3 Mar 1860 in Arkansas and was baptized⁵⁴ Jul 1875 in Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died 13 Apr 1921 and was buried⁹ in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.



July 1875: joined Mt. Olive Baptist church by "experience and baptism" (Mt. Olive Records, p. 39).
Aug 1881: elected as an alternate delegate to the church association (Mt. Olive Records, p. 53).
Feb 1884: brought up on charges of dancing and using profane language; admitted to and reconciled May 1884 (Mt. Olive Records, p. 57)
August 1894: Joe was ordained a deacon of Mt. Olive baptist church (ibid, p. 87).
Joe served as Ashley County judge from 1912 to 1916 ["Reflections of Ashley County", p. 90].

- M vii. **Samuel Jackson RILEY**¹⁶ was born²³ 15 Mar 1863 in Arkansas. He died 1 Jan 1878 and was buried in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Apr 1873: member of the "Sabbath School" at Mt. Olive Baptist Church (Mt. Olive records, p. 34a).

- F viii. **Susan Elizabeth RILEY** "Susie"¹⁶ was born²³ 28 Feb 1866 in Arkansas. She died 1 Oct 1913 and was buried in Hamburg Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas⁵⁵.

Owned and operated hotels in Hamburg (Reflections of Ashley Co., p. 225).
From the Ashley County Eagle, January 23, 1908:
"Mrs. S. E. Linder of this city, and Mr. Lou Elkins of Indiana were united in marriage by Rev. F. P. Doak at the home of the bride last Sunday evening at 6:30."

- M ix. **Robert Randolph RILEY**¹⁶ was born^{13,23} 12 Nov 1868 in Arkansas. He died^{13,28} 11 Apr 1944 in Ashley Co., Arkansas and was buried¹³ in Hamburg Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

Mar 1883: excluded from fellowship of the Mt. Olive Baptist Church due to "dancing" (Mt. Olive Records, p. 56).
9 Sep 1884: joined Central Baptist Church, left via "letter" in 1891.
23 Jul 1887: considered in "disorder" according to Central Baptist Church records
27 Aug 1887: made concessions to the church (Central Baptist Church) (Note that Eliza McDougald, Robert's future wife would join the church this same day by "experience and baptism").
In 1891 Robert rejoined Mt. Olive Baptist church "by letter" along with wife Eliza. They were members there until 3 April 1909 when they left by letter (Mt. Olive Records, p. 72).

- F x. **Louisa Jane RILEY** "Lula"¹⁶ was born^{16,17} 9 May 1871 in Arkansas. She died⁹ 21 Apr 1890 and was buried⁹ in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

- M xi. **George Thomas RILEY** "Big George"¹⁶ was born¹⁷ 7 Jul 1873 in Arkansas and was baptized⁵⁶ 10 Aug 1889 in Central Baptist Church, Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas. He died²² 26 Jul 1951 and was buried⁹ in Mt. Olive Cemetery, Ashley Co., Arkansas.

George joined Central Baptist Church of Berea, Ashley Co., Arkansas in August 1889 and was a member through April 1899. In April 1899 he is noted as joining Mt. Olive Baptist Church of Berea (Mt. Olive Records, p. 72).

Lived his entire life in the home in which he was born--that of his father James Cooper Riley (Reflections of Ashley County, p 371).

From George's 1918 WW I Registration card, he is described as "tall and stout with blue eyes and brown hair."

Following are entries from the records of the Central Baptist Church:

September 10th 1892 "Bro. George Riley made satisfactory concessions to the church for using profanity."

February 4th 1893 "Charges was preferred against Bro. George Riley and Ab Knight for drunkenness and a committee Bro. J. B. Franklin and E. T. Johnson was to notify them of charges against them."

June 3rd 1893 (after several deferrals at monthly meetings) "Bro. George Riley's case was taken up and the church withdrew fellowship from him."

August 1894, George is restored to Central Baptist Church.

April 8th, 1899: "Bro. George Riley called for a letter of dismissal which was granted"

TAYLOR to his wife Elizabeth Newsom TAYLOR, a little more than one month prior to his death. The letter is addressed to Mrs. Elizabeth Taylor, Beaverdam, Clark County, Mississippi.

Calaforma Tuolama [Tuolumne] Co. Sanora
March the 6th 1853

Dear Elizabeth

I take the present opportunity of writing you a few lines to in form you that I am well with the exceptions of a bad cold and hope these few lines will find you all the Same. I arrived at Sanfrancisco on the 19th of feb. and came to this place the 22nd and found in the post office a letter from Alexander and last Sunday I met with him hear and have came hear to day to meet him and Andrews and I Expect to gow with them this Evening. I am with some men that appear very willing for me to stay with them but they do not Suit me I have nothing of importance wright We had a great deal of sickness on the Ship in going from panaman [or panamar] to Sanfrancisco their dyed a bout fifty one day 10 or 12. [I think he means that about 50 men died enrout and one day 10 or 12 died.] Some nights their would be 5 or 6 Some hollowing and scrambling and dying clost to me and expected by time next thought to keep from taking the diseases I slept out on the herricane deck as much as possible and when I slept in by birth I would open the port hole

and I lie with my face at it So as to keep from Smelling the cent of the Ship and to get pure air and have Escapt Sickness, only a bad cold.

I have worked hear some but have not made a nery thing yet more than board Some people hear are making large Sumes of gold and others are not making anything worth a mention walker I have joined a compony to go on _____ river we have cent 15 to min ____ the[?] to prospect the Start to day and will be back in 3 or 4 weeks the presumption that a man can make his pile their a shorttime and we have sent those men to se and they are to report to the company that sends them Write me at this place direct your letter to Sonora Calafornia Tuolla Co

(signed) John Taylor
