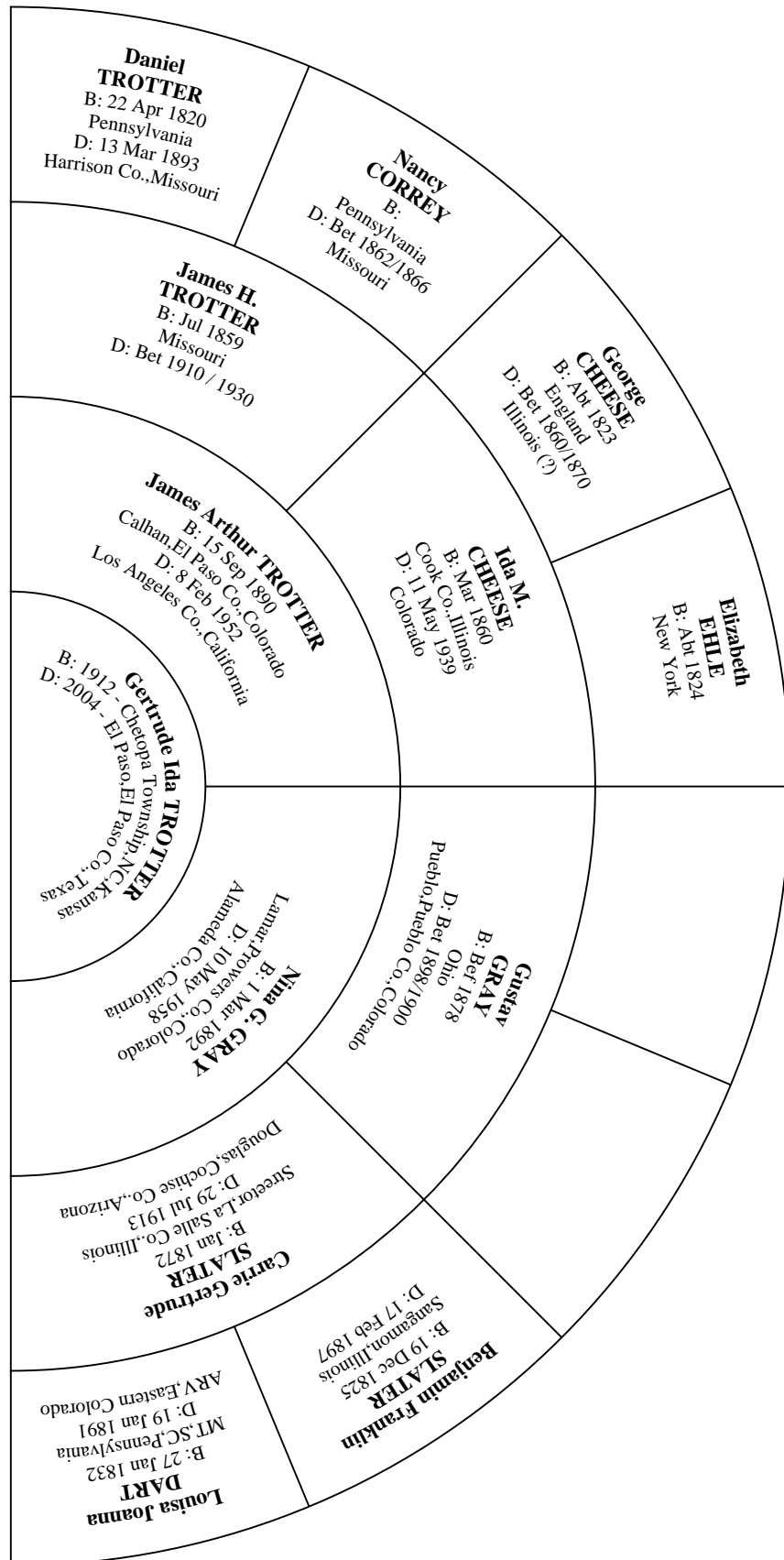

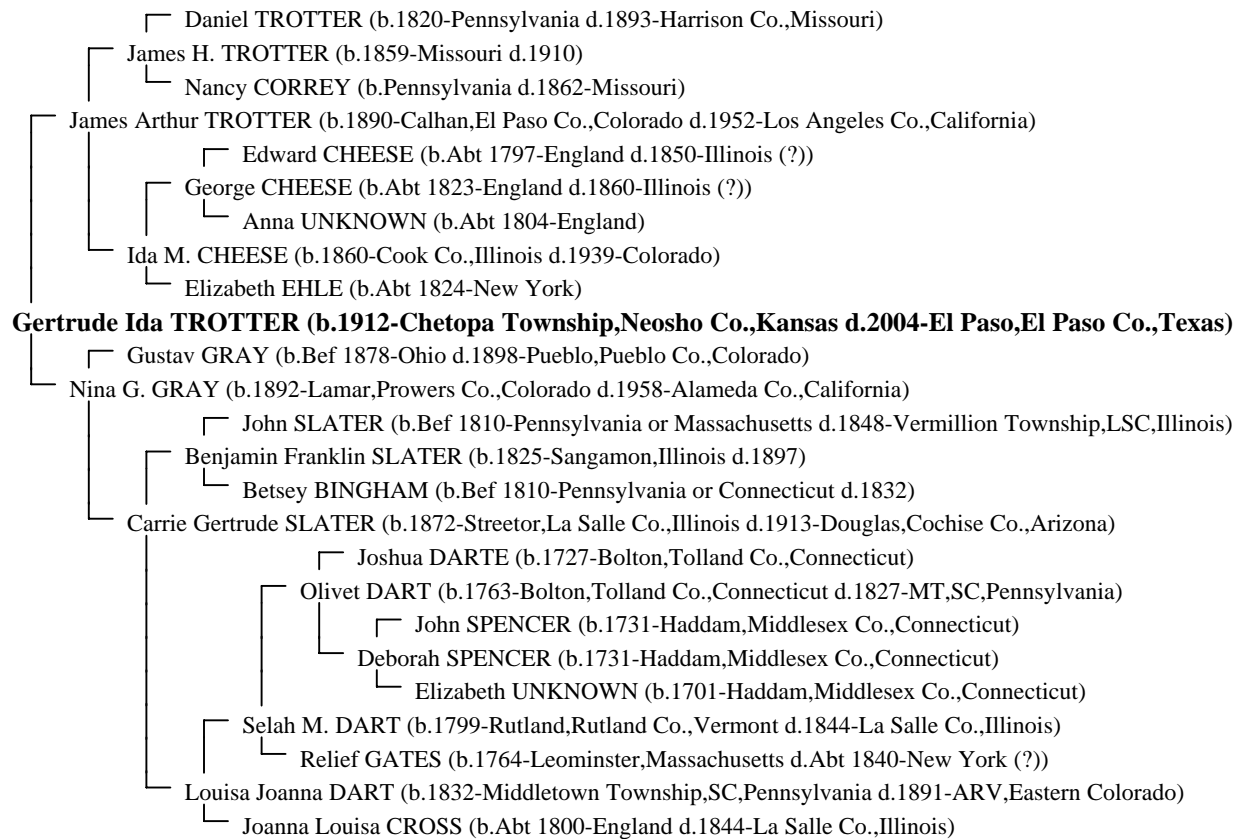

First Generation

1. **Gertrude Ida TROTTER** was born¹ 5 May 1912 in Chetopa Township, Neosho Co., Kansas. She died 3 Mar 2004 in El Paso, El Paso Co., Texas.

Gertrude was named after her two grandmothers: her maternal grandmother Gertrude Slater and her paternal grandmother Ida Cheese.

Obituary from Mar 6, 2004:

Gertrude married² **Charles R. MOORE**² about 1929. Charles was born² about 1907 in Texas.

Second Generation

2. **James Arthur TROTTER** "Art"¹ was born^{1,3,4,5} 15 Sep 1890 in Calhan, El Paso Co., Colorado. He died⁵ 8 Feb 1952 in Los Angeles Co., California. Art married⁶ Nina G. GRAY about Apr 1910.

James Arthur Trotter, "Art", was born 15 September 1890, in Calhan, Colorado. Art was the youngest of four children born to James Sr. and Ida Trotter. In 1900, Art was living with his parents in Otero Co., Colorado.

Around April 1910 at the age of 19 Art married Nina Gray. They are noted as newlyweds in the 1910 census and residing at 524 Colorado Ave in Ordway, Colorado. (At the time, Ordway was still part of Otero county, and later became Crowley county). James' older brother Charles also lived in Ordway, just two streets over on Otero Ave in a boarding house. By 1912, Art and Nina had made their way to Kansas, where in 1912 their first child, Gertrude was born in Neosho county. According to Gertrude's birth certificate, Art was a "farmer" at the time.

They would not reside there long, for the following year they would move to Douglas, Arizona. From Art's 1917 World War I draft registration card, they are known to be residing at 1530 21st Street in Douglas, Arizona. At this time, Art is working as a smelter craneman, employed by Phelps Dodge at the Copper Queen Branch as part of the copper mining industry. (Nina's younger brothers were also in Douglas with them at this time, with Bob living with them). Although mining was a prevalent industry in the west during this time, it's of interest to note that Art intentionally or not somewhat followed in his father's footsteps, as he also worked at mining when he was about Art's age (in Utah, 1880). From Art's WW I registration card, he is known to have been "tall and slender" with "brown eyes" and "light hair". It is also seen that he has a "weak right leg and foot being broken in 3 places." Art and Nina stayed in Arizona through at least October of 1918 when their third child, Delbert was born.

By 1920 the family had moved again, and from the census they are renting a home at 1934 Hermosa Ave, Hermosa Beach, California (see the scrapbook page of the multimedia edition of this report for a photo of the probable lot where the house was). Art is still employed as a crane operator, now supporting the shipping industry. At about this same time, Art and Nina are separated (it is known that Nina had remarried by 1921).

Art remarried to Mona Kriss about 1924, and around 1926 Art and Mona had a son, they named James, which was also the name of Art's first son with Nina. (Nina moved out of the southern California area and had custody of the children--see Nina's biography). In 1930 Art and Mona resided in Los Angeles, California, where they owned a home at 206 E. 112th Street (see the scrapbook page of the multimedia edition of this report for a photo of the area). At this time Art was employed as an auto mechanic.

Art died 8 February 1952 at the age of 61 in Los Angeles county California.

3. **Nina G. GRAY**⁵ was born^{1,2} 1 Mar 1892 in Lamar, Prowers Co., Colorado. She died⁵ 10 May 1958 in Alameda Co., California.

Nina was born on March 1, 1892 in Lamar, Prowers County, Colorado. She was the oldest of three children born to Gustav Gray and Carrie Gertrude Slater Gray. Before turning four years old, Nina's family moved farther west to Las Animas in Bent County, or 35 miles upstream the Arkansas River from Lamar. Nina's father died around the time Nina was only six to eight years old. In 1900, eight year old Nina is living in Bent County, Colorado, with her two younger brothers and mother Gertrude.



Around April, 1910, Nina would marry James Arthur "Art" Trotter, and for the 1910 census they were residing at 524 Colorado Ave., in Ordway, Colorado (see the scrapbook page of the multimedia edition of this report for a photo of this area). Ordway was another 20 miles west or so upstream the Arkansas River from her previous home in Bent County.

Nina and Art had a number of moves, going to Neosho Co., Kansas where their first child, Gertrude Ida was born in May, 1912. Soon they headed back west moving to Douglas, Arizona, where they were thought to be by 1913. It is likely that Nina's widowed mother Gertrude, whom they named their daughter after, also accompanied them with these moves, as well as her two younger brothers. Tragedy would strike soon after their arrival in Arizona, for in July 1913, Nina's mother Gertrude committed suicide.

The town of Douglas, Arizona was dominated by the mining industry and the copper mines of Phelps Dodge. From the 1917 and 1918 World War I registration cards of Art and Nina's younger brothers, it is seen that Nina's brother Bob lived with Nina and Art, and her brother Roy lived nearby-with all three men employed by Phelps Dodge. During this time they lived at 1530 21st St., in Douglas, Arizona.

Nina and Art stayed in Douglas, Arizona, through at least late 1918, when their third child was born. Soon the family moved to California, where in 1920 they resided at 1934 Hermosa Ave. in Hermosa Beach with their three children (see the scrapbook page of the multimedia edition of this report for a photo of the probable lot where the house was). Nina's younger brothers may have left Arizona before they did, as they were enlisted for the Great War, World War I. (In 1920 the youngest, Roy, is known to have been in Coblenz, Germany).

About this time Nina and Art separated for unknown reasons, and she would remarry to William "Bill" Lawrence Fluharty by 1921 and move north with the three kids and Bill to the Sacramento area. March, 1922 would bring another tragic event, when the youngest child Delbert was killed at the age of three while crossing the street. Nina and Bill remained in the Sacramento area through at least 1924.

The family would move to Texas, arriving there by 1928. In 1930 they resided in El Paso, Texas at 1413 Kentucky Street, where they would live for at least 15 years. Nina and Bill had a total of four children together. Nina had a total of six children living to adulthood.

At some point in her life Nina played piano in a movie house in Las Vegas, New Mexico [James Hammond interview]. Sometime after 1945 Nina made her way back to California where she would pass away. Nina died May 10, 1958, in Alameda County, California at the age of 66.

Obituary excerpt from the 19 Jan 2005 "Daily Review", "San Mateo County Times"

JAMES ARTHUR FLUHARTY A ten-year resident of San Ramon, died Sunday, January 16, 2005, at the age of 90 years. Beloved husband of the late Katy Fluharty, and son of the late James Trotter and Nina Fluharty, and stepson of the late William Fluharty. Loving father and father-in-law of Linda A. and Lloyd Myers of San Ramon. Devoted grandfather of Katie and husband, Patrick Pike, of San Ramon, and Shannon Myers of San Ramon. Dear brother of William Fluharty of Cathey's Valley, Calif., Lorraine Shahan of Arizona, Lloyd Trotter of Hawthorne, and the late Gertrude Hammond, and Richard Fluharty. Mr. Fluharty resided in Hayward from 1959 to 1995. He was a retired employee of Union Carbide and a member of the Masonic Story Lodge of Provo, Utah.



- M iii. **Delbert H. TROTTER**⁹ was born^{7,9,10} 27 Oct 1918 in Cochise Co., Arizona. He died⁹ 29 Mar 1922 and was buried in Sacramento, California¹¹.

Delbert was killed when he was three years old. He was hit by a car while following his brother across the street. [James Byrne Hammond interviews, 2004, 2005]

Delbert was likely named after his great uncle, Adelbert "Bert" Slater. It's also probable that his middle name, though unknown, after that of his paternal grandfather, James H. Trotter. (Delbert's older sister was named after her maternal grandparents, and his older brother was a "Jr.").



Third Generation

4. **James H. TROTTER**³ was born³ Jul 1859 in Missouri. He died Bet 1910 / 1930^{12,13}. James married^{3,6} Ida M. CHEESE about 1882.

James H. Trotter was born in Missouri in July, 1859, and was the third child of Daniel Trotter and Nancy Correy Trotter. James' mother died when he was young, sometime between 1862 and 1867. In 1870 James is 11 years old and living in Union Township, Harrison County, Missouri with his two sisters, a brother, and a half brother born after his father remarried to Mary (last name unknown).

James ventured out west as a young man and in 1880 at the age of 20 he was working as a miner in Ogden, Utah. Soon James met Ida Cheese and they married around 1882. James and Ida stayed in Utah until at least May, 1883 when their first child, Mabel, was born. However, they would soon make a number of moves, first heading back east to Missouri where in December, 1886 their second child, Charles, was born. By July, 1888, the family had made its way back west to Colorado when their third child, Elizabeth or "Lilly" was born. Finally, in September 1890 their fourth child, James Arthur or "Art" was born in Calhan, Colorado, some 30 miles northeast of Colorado Springs.

The family would remain in Colorado, and in 1900 they were living in eastern Colorado's Arkansas River Valley in Otero County where James was employed as a stock farmer. The family would eventually move west, going farther upstream the Arkansas River and in 1910 James, age 50 and Ida resided in Fremont County, near (or in the southern part of) Canon City. At this time, three of their four

children had left the house, with the exception of their daughter Lilly. James is listed as being a farmer.

James died sometime between 1910 and 1930. The 1920 census has not been located for the family, and in 1930 his wife Ida is shown to be a widow, living in Colorado Springs.

5. **Ida M. CHEESE**³ was born Mar 1860^{3,14} in Cook Co., Illinois^{3,14}. She died 11 May 1939 in Colorado.

Ida M. Cheese was born March, 1859 (or 1860) in Chicago, Cook Co., Illinois, and was the sixth of eight children born to George and Elizabeth Ehle Cheese. Her family moved out of the city to the south, where in 1870 eleven year old Ida and the family lived in Du Page Township, Will County, Illinois.

It is thought that Ida and her family moved to Utah sometime prior to 1882, where Ida met and married James H. Trotter. While in Utah Ida and James had their first child Mabel in May, 1883. (Perhaps Ida's middle initial is for Mabel?) Ida and James would move often over the next few years, heading back east to Missouri (where James was from), then heading back west to Colorado. Ida and James had a total of four children, with the last born in September, 1890. By 1900 the family was settled in the Arkansas River Valley of eastern Colorado, and in 1910 Ida and James lived in Canon City, Colorado (see James' biography for more details).

Ida would become a widow sometime between 1910 and 1930 (a 1920 census has not been located). In 1930 she is 71 years old and residing in a boarding house in Colorado Springs at 208 N Wahsatch Ave.

Ida died on May 11, 1939 in Colorado. An obituary has been located on her, but not yet obtained.

They had the following children:

F i. **Mabel TROTTER** was born³ May 1883 in Utah.

M ii. **Charles H. TROTTER**³ was born³ Dec 1886 in Missouri.

In 1910 Charles was living in Ordway, Colorado (then part of Otero County, now part of Crowley County).

F iii. **Elizabeth TROTTER** "Lillian"^{3,12} was born³ Jul 1888 in Colorado.

2 M iv. **James Arthur TROTTER** was born 15 Sep 1890 and died 8 Feb 1952.

6. **Gustav GRAY**¹⁵ was born² before 1878 in Ohio. He died Bet 1898/1900¹⁶ in Pueblo, Pueblo Co., Colorado^{11,16}. Gustav married Carrie Gertrude SLATER on 22 Oct 1889¹⁵ in Prowers Co., Colorado¹⁵.

Gustav's birth surname was "Grau". [Kathleen Davis GEDCOM]

7. **Carrie Gertrude SLATER**¹⁵ was born Jan 1872^{15,16,17} in Streeter, La Salle Co., Illinois^{15,16,17}. She died 29 Jul 1913¹⁸ in Douglas, Cochise Co., Arizona^{15,18} and was buried 30 Jul 1913¹⁸ in Douglas, Cochise Co., Arizona¹⁸.

Carrie Gertrude Slater was born in January, 1872 in Streeter, La Salle County, Illinois. Gertrude was the fifth of seven children born to Benjamin Franklin Slater and Louisa Joanna Dart. In 1884 the family moved to the Arkansas River Valley of eastern Colorado [1].

Gertrude would meet Gustav "Gus" Gray, and on October 22, 1889 they were married in Prowers County, Colorado. The marriage brought forth three children, but it would be short lived as Gustav died sometime between 1898 and 1900. Family tradition has passed down that Gus died from sunstroke while on the range as a cowboy, but he apparently died in the Colorado State Insane Asylum in Pueblo, Colorado [2].

In 1900, a widowed 28 year old Gertrude is residing in Bent County, Colorado, with her three children. Gertrude remarried sometime prior to 1910 to Carl (or Earle) E. Campbell. In 1910 they lived at 1011 East Ninth Street in Pueblo, Colorado. Gertrude had a child with Carl, but the baby died in

Gertrude a widow for the second time.

It is probable that around 1911 Gertrude accompanied her newlywed daughter Nina and son in law Art to Kansas, where they were known to be in 1912 for the birth of their first child, Gertrude Ida Trotter. The baby was obviously named after Gertrude, but she was also the namesake of Art's mother, Ida. Regardless of whether Gertrude went with her daughter to Kansas, by 1913 Gertrude and her three children and son in law all lived in Douglas, Arizona, where the men were employed in the copper mining industry [3].

It is not known what troubled Gertrude, but she would tragically end her own life on July 29, 1913 in Douglas, Arizona [4]. Gertrude was only 41 years old, and was buried in Douglas, Arizona.

[3] There is some amount of supposition concluding the entire family was there by 1913-it is known that Art and Nina were in Douglas by 1914 (the birth of their second child), and that by 1917 that Art, Nina along with Nina's brothers were in Douglas. Given that Gertrude died 1913 in Douglas, it's assumed the entire family went to Douglas together around 1913.

[4] Gertrude's death certificate states that she died from a gunshot to the head "delivered by her own hand." (from Linda Fluharty Myers).

From Bob's 1917 World War I registration card, he is noted as being a Smelterman for P. D. Corp., Copper Queen Branch, Roaster Department, in Douglas, Arizona. At this time he lives at 1530 21st street, the same residence as his older sister Nina and husband Art (who also worked for the copper mine). Bob is described as being "tall and slender with grey eyes and light hair."



- M iii. **Cecil Roy GRAY**^{15,19,20} was born 4 Sep 1898^{15,16,19} in Colorado^{15,16}.

Roy's 1918 World War I registration card indicates he was living in Douglas, Arizona, and employed as a "blast furnaceman" for Phelps Dodge Corporation (copper mine operations). He resides at 734 16th Street, and his older sister Nina, her husband Art, and his older brother Bob also live in Douglas.

Roy is described as being of "medium height and slender build with light gray eyes and light brown hair."



Fourth Generation

- 8. **Daniel TROTTER**²¹ was born^{3,21,22} 22 Apr 1820 in Pennsylvania. He died²² 13 Mar 1893 in Harrison Co., Missouri. Daniel married Nancy CORREY before 1852.

10. **George CHEESE**¹⁴ was born³ about 1823¹⁴ in England¹⁴ and immigrated 27 Apr 1830²⁵ in New York, New York²⁵. He died Bet 1860/1870^{14,26} in Illinois (?). George married Elizabeth EHLE.
- George came from England as a child with his parents Edward and Ann and arrived in New York at the age of seven on April 27, 1830.

11. **Elizabeth EHLE**^{11,14} was born³ about 1824¹⁴ in New York¹⁴.

14. **Benjamin Franklin SLATER**^{17,21} was born¹⁷ 19 Dec 1825¹⁵ in Sangamon, Illinois¹⁵. He died 17 Feb 1897¹⁵. Benjamin married Louisa Joanna DART on 28 Jan 1852¹⁵ in La Salle Co., Illinois¹⁵.
- Benjamin and Louisa were married by E. N. Jencks, Minister of the Gospel.
Moved his family from La Salle Co., Illinois to the Arkansas River Valley in Eastern Colorado in 1881. After his wife died in Colorado, he returned to Illinois. (Newspaper article on son Bert)

15. **Louisa Joanna DART**¹⁵ was born¹⁷ 27 Jan 1832¹⁵ in Middletown Township, Susquehanna Co., Pennsylvania¹⁵. She died 19 Jan 1891¹⁵ in Arkansas River Valley, Eastern Colorado^{15,28}.

They had the following children:

- M i. **Elwin Merrill SLATER**^{15,17} was born¹⁷ Apr 1856¹⁵ in Illinois¹⁵. He died 7 Oct 1903¹⁵ in Pueblo, Colorado¹⁵.

Elwin was a poiceman an d killed on duty. [Kathleen Davis GEDCOM]
- F ii. **Lillian Rosaline SLATER**^{15,17} was born¹⁷ about 1859 in Illinois.
- M iii. **Frank Lester SLATER**^{15,17} was born¹⁷ about 1864 in Illinois.
- F iv. **Ella Bell SLATER**¹⁷ was born¹⁷ about 1866 in Illinois.
- 7 F v. **Carrie Gertrude SLATER** was born Jan 1872 and died 29 Jul 1913.
- F vi. **Mary Greta SLATER**¹⁵ was born 17 Jun 1874¹⁵. She died 6 Sep 1874¹⁵.

- M vii. **Adelbert Anson SLATER** "Bert"^{17,29} was born 1876³⁰ in La Salle Co., Illinois³⁰. He died after 1956³⁰.



Fifth Generation

20. **Edward CHEESE**³¹ was born about 1797³¹ in England³¹ and immigrated 27 Apr 1830²⁵ in New York, New York²⁵. He died Bet 1850/1860^{14,32} in Illinois (?). Edward married³¹ Anna UNKNOWN.

In 1830 at the time of Edward's immigration to the the United States, he is noted as being a gunsmith.

21. **Anna UNKNOWN**³¹ was born about 1804³¹ in England³¹ and immigrated 27 Apr 1830²⁵ in New York, New York²⁵.

They had the following children:

- 10 M i. **George CHEESE** was born about 1823 and died Bet 1860/1870.

28. **John SLATER**³³ was born¹⁷ before 1810 in Pennsylvania or Massachusetts³³. He died 1848³³ in Vermillion Township, La Salle Co., Illinois³³. John married Betsey BINGHAM.

Died of cholera [Kathleen Davis GEDCOM].

29. **Betsey BINGHAM** "Bessie"³³ was born¹⁷ before 1810 in Pennsylvania or Connecticut³³. She died 1832³³.

They had the following children:

- 14 M i. **Benjamin Franklin SLATER** was born 19 Dec 1825 and died 17 Feb 1897.

30. **Selah M. DART**¹⁵ was born¹⁷ 1799¹⁵ in Rutland, Rutland Co., Vermont¹⁵. He died 10 Sep 1844¹⁵ in La Salle Co., Illinois¹⁵. Selah married Joanna Louisa CROSS.

31. **Joanna Louisa CROSS**¹⁵ was born¹⁷ about 1800¹⁵ in England¹⁵. She died 12 Jul 1844¹⁵ in La Salle Co., Illinois¹⁵.

Joanna came to America as a small child [Kathleen Davis GEDCOM].

From her daughter's 1880 census (Louisa Joanna Dart Slater), Joanna's birth location is given as "On Ocean".

They had the following children:

- M v. **Anson Selah DART**¹⁵ was born 26 Feb 1834¹⁵ in Oneida, New York¹⁵. He died 3 Apr 1904¹⁵ in Worth, Cook Co., Illinois¹⁵ and was buried in Drummer Township Cemetery, Gibson, Illinois¹⁵.

60. **Olivet DART**¹⁵ was born 2 Apr 1763¹⁵ in Bolton, Tolland Co., Connecticut¹⁵. He died 1827¹⁵ in Middlefield Township, Susquehanna Co., Pennsylvania¹⁵. Olivet married¹⁵ Relief GATES.

After his birth in 1763, Olivet's family moved to Gilsum, NH. The family moved to Weathersfield by 1782. Joshua went back and forth between Gilsum and Surey NH, and Weathersfield, Vt. Olivet was living in Weathersfield, unmarried, in 1791. [Kathleen Davis GEDCOM]

61. **Relief GATES**¹⁵ was born 25 Aug 1764¹⁵ in Leominster, Massachusetts¹⁵. She died about 1840¹⁵ in New York (?)¹⁵.

They had the following children:
